Teaching, learning & leadership CPD

(starting during autumn 2008, plus repeats)

University of Cumbria/NUT CPD

A new professional learning partnership with UoC to offer Masters level transferrable accreditation. The initial programme will include:

- **The 3Rs of behaviour – responsibility, respect and resilience** for **primary teachers in Cumbria** (tt/65R). 19 and 20 January + follow-up on 1 May. Located on UoC campus. Tutored by Rob Long.
- Three **study groups (south, east and coastal Cumbria)** for teachers in Cumbria (all KSs) starting in January 2009. The first module will focus on systematic enquiry. Over one term participants will engage in 12½hrs taught sessions plus similar time on school-based study leading to 20 M-level points.
- A new course for **early career teachers** (2nd to 5th year inclusive) in **Tower Hamlets, London**.
