These high quality CPD opportunities will transform participants' teaching careers, build capacity in schools to meet the requirement to promote international development and understanding, and enrich pupils' learning in the global century.

On each course, 12 pairs of primary or secondary teachers will: attend a two-day seminar led by an expert tutor; trial 'internationalising' teaching and learning strategies in their schools, supporting one another using peer coaching; and take part in a two-day follow-up seminar to share their successes with other participants.

All participants will also have access to a dedicated online forum.

School leaders and teachers are invited to plan when and where it will best suit them and their schools to take part. Participation in this 'once in a career'

professional development opportunity is **free** and open to all teachers.
