FOR: Black and minority ethnic (BME) teachers in the second to fifth years of teaching who are interested in developing their leadership skills and knowledge.

AIMS: The ‘TWENTY-FOUR’ seminar will extend participants:

- leadership skills and knowledge about leadership;
- awareness of career development options with an emphasis on leadership roles within schools;
- understanding of and strength in managing cultural diversity in changing educational landscape; and
- skills in planning or consolidating their route map to leadership.

COST: £25 (NUT members); £150 (others) – includes VAT, lunch and refreshments on both days. OPTIONAL dinner and B&B (£50) at end of first day can be requested in advance. (Special conditions apply to London overnight stays. Please see box below.)

The following apply to courses in London only:

- A limited number of bedrooms are booked and will be allocated on a first come, first served basis.
- A two week notification period, up to the CPD event, is needed to book accommodation for the Friday evening.
- A list of hotels near the venue can be made available where accommodation needs cannot be arranged.

NUT members pay up to the first £30 of their travel costs and can reclaim any amount in excess of that (with receipts for mileage up to a maximum of the equivalent of second class rail fare). NUT cannot pay for supply cover. Costs are eligible for funding from CPD funding which is delegated to schools.
